Message from the President

Message from the FWGGA President:

Greeting fellow FWGGA members,

We've had an action-packed summer season here in the Florida grape and wine industry! An interesting growing season, led up to an early harvest, followed by back-to-back hurricanes. "Let me up, I've had enough!!". Thankfully I have no reports of catastrophic storm damage from our membership. Growers and wine makers are a resilient and optimistic bunch. We will forge ahead and make the best of 2024.

Since the hurricanes, I've had the opportunity to speak with growers and winemakers from the panhandle to south-central Florida. Growers, almost universally, reported increased yields over 2023 (most being at or above industry averages). Two themes were repeated by winery owners across the State; lackluster to declining wine sales, through the first three quarters of the year, and an increased difficulty in finding / retaining good winery employees. 2024 has brought fewer visitors to wineries and those who did visit, spent less. Sluggish sales and inflated input costs are pinching profits and forcing winery operators to be creative with staffing and promotions. These issues are not unique to the Florida Wine industry, across the country, Wine, Beer and Liquor sales are seeing a slump.


It's certainly not all doom and gloom. Several new Florida wineries, both large and small, have opened in the past two years with winery operators being optimistic for 2025. There is exciting research in Florida's university system, yielding promising early results on several PD resistant California bred bunch grapes for wine production. The future for Florida's wine industry is bright.

I'm looking forward to seeing you all in January at the annual conference. We'll have the opportunity to catch up with old friends, welcome new folks to the industry and of course share some of Florida's best wine.



New Disease Resilient Grapes Present Economic Potential for Florida's Wine Industry

The University of Florida/IFAS Plant Science Research and Education Center in Citra, FL has been researching several varieties of disease resilient grapes developed by the University of California, Davis to identify their growth potential in the state of Florida. According to the center, the harvest of "one particular grape variety is already showing promising signs of resistance to Pierce's Disease." The success of the vitis vinifiera grape could expand Florida's wine industry by enabling the production of more traditional European-style wines in the state. This exciting breakthrough may offer significant economic potential for the state through the advancement of Florida's viticulture and agritourism activities.
